


WHAT WE KNOW - DAY 9: FRIDAY MARCH 4

- <u>Russians have seized</u> Europe's largest nuclear power plant at Zaporizhzhia after a fire blazed for hours, following an alleged Russian attack before being extinguished early on Friday.
- The State Nuclear Regulatory Inspectorate of Ukraine said that employees of the plant were continuing to work and that they were carrying out inspections to identify any damage to the site. However, the agency said that any loss of the power station's ability to cool down nuclear fuel would lead to "significant radioactive releases into the environment".
- **Mariupol** suffered another night of brutal bombardment. The port city, home to almost half a million people, is surrounded by Russian troops and lacking food, water and electricity.
- There were reports of fighting in the urban centres of Enerhodar, close to the Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant, and Severodonetsk overnight.

Key reported air strikes Key reported ground & naval attacks



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

The number of refugees pouring out of Ukraine to flee the fighting has reached 1.3mn

since Russia invaded, the UN refugee agency reported.

Half of the refugees have travelled to Poland, with Hungary and Moldova among other important destinations. The UNHCR said more than 50,000 refugees had gone to Russia.







On Tuesday February 22, Putin <u>recognised the separatist governments</u> in **Luhansk** and **Donetsk**, two provinces in the eastern Donbas region of Ukraine, and <u>ordered</u> <u>Russian troops</u> to enter them. On Thursday February 24, Moscow began a full-scale invasion of the country.
